Frank Lee then introduced the evening speaker, Mr. Bill Barnet. Frank noted that Bill Barnet belongs to a long-term committee for Spartanburg County, which is focusing on revitalizing Spartanburg and the area around GSM. The area that Bill Barnet is committed to is called "The Northside Initiative." Bill Barnet's vision for "The Northside Initiative" is to help alleviate poverty while revitalizing the community and "creating a better Spartanburg." The

Initiative is to develop a thriving, diverse community home to mixed-income housing, mixed-use commercial development, an innovative new curriculum and public school model at Cleveland Academy of Leadership, and access to health and wellness programming at a new state-of-the-art T.K. Gregg Community Center.

Bill also stated, "There is no question that the success and future development of our City is inextricably linked to the revitalization of the Northside."

In conclusion, Kevin Koger once again approached the podium and thanked the staff and volunteers of Greater Spartanburg Ministries. Kevin ended with prayer closing out the evening.

CARING FOR THE CAROLINAS HOSTS FOOD DRIVE FOR GSM Over 800 pounds of food and \$71 was collected

On June 18th, GSM was the recipient of a local food drive hosted by WSPA's Jack Roper and Caring for the Carolina's. The food drive, held at Ingles on Hwy 9 in Boiling Springs, was sponsored by Harrison, White, Smith and Coggins attorneys, Hardees and Bath Fitters. The food drive came at a great time for GSM. During the summer months, children are out of school so many in Spartanburg county will go without their scheduled daily lunch. GSM Facility Coordinator Greg Whisnant stated, "We see a lot of kids and the elderly in the



summer time who need food." GSM CEO Kevin Koger added, "One in six in Spartanburg County are hungry. When kids are out for the summer, we see a spike in demand for food. We are here to serve any resident of Spartanburg County."

GSM PARTICIPATES IN ANNUAL MAIL CARRIER FOOD DRIVE Over 3,000 pounds of food was collected to help feed our needy



On May 10th, letter carriers in more than 10,000 cities and towns across America participated in the NALC Stamp Out Hunger National Food Drive. Letter carriers, postal employees and other volunteers collected non-perishable food donations left by mailboxes and in post offices and delivered them to local community food banks, pantries and shelters. USPS and Campbell Soup Company are major supporters. Campbell Soup earmarked an additional 1 million pounds of canned food to the drive.

To donate, just place a box or can of non-

perishable food next to your mailbox before your letter carrier delivers mail. The carrier will do the rest. The food is sorted, and delivered to an area food bank or pantry, where it is available for needy families. With more than 50 million people facing hunger every day in America, including nearly 17 million children, this drive is one way you can help those in your own city or town who need help.
